



Sam William Rizzo

October 8, 1935 - January 1, 2018

Samuel William Rizzo passed away on the 1st day of the year 2018. He was 82 years old and led a very robust and gregarious life.

He was born October 8, 1935 in Houston, Texas to Lucille and Cosimo Rizzo. He was the 2nd child with 2 sisters, Rosemary Parisi and Jan Sellers. Sam lived in Houston for his first 7 years until the family moved near Dayton, Texas where he met the love of his life, Juanita Joy Holbrook. They were married October 26, 1957 after Sam completed a Bachelor of Commerce degree from the University of Notre Dame. They were married for 60 years. Sam and Nita had four children; Samuel Cosimo, Daniel Chester, David William and Mary Elizabeth. From the start of Sam and Nita's already large family grew an even larger family, which Sam loved very much. Samuel Cosimo married Jill Lynn Neathery and have 3 children, Joshua, Sean and Samantha. Dan is married to Kristine Lancaster and has 3 children, Danielle, Nicholas and Will. David married Lynn Coons and have 4 children, Olivia, Madalyn, David and Nolan. Elizabeth married Tim Moore and have 2 children, Elissa and Sam. And the family continues from these 12 grandchildren to 3 more great grandchildren, Braden, Ashton, Navie and 2 more on the way.

Sam grew up in Liberty, Texas where he attended Liberty High School. He was the Student Body President, lettered all 4 years in band and was a star athlete in track and football. He and 3 of his good friends were the 3A Texas State Champions in 4x400 meter relay. He was also awarded Best Actor in One Act Play.

He served as a squadron leader during boot camp in the United States Air Force Reserve, and was honorably discharged February 3, 1964.

Sam continued his education and ultimately became a Certified Public Accountant (CPA). In the bold and typical fashion of Sam, he owned and operated his own CPA firm for several years before being hired by the WEDGE group as the Operating Director. After WEDGE, he started his own oil & gas service company called RESCO (Rizzo Energy Services Company) in 1979. During the big 1981 oil crisis, he sold it and went to work for Waltrip Enterprises before becoming the Executive Vice President and Chief Financial Officer for Service Corporation International. In addition, he served as a Board member for Cash America International and Tanknology Corporation.

Other than his tremendous success in the financial world, Sam's true passion was his

service to several Catholic churches throughout his life including being one of the founding members of St. Albert's Catholic church, and a big supporter of St. Thomas High School in Houston. In addition to his service to the Catholic community, he dedicated himself to the Lighthouse of Houston for the Blind. He volunteered 10 years to the Lighthouse Board of Directors ultimately serving as the Chairman. During his tenure, he was instrumental in activating key technological advances at the Lighthouse; one of which was the first ever computer system to allow blind people the ability to document medical transcriptions for physicians.

Sam and Nita moved to Madisonville, Texas in 2000 where they owned and operated 2 large ranches, SANITA and Greenbriar. They continued their philanthropy being very involved with St. Elizabeth Ann Seton's Catholic church, the Madisonville County Fair, and were charitable to several other organizations in Madisonville.

Sam will be dearly missed by all.

The funeral mass will start at 11:00 am on Saturday, January 6, 2018 at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Catholic church in Madisonville. The grandsons and great grandson will be pallbearers.
