



## A.L. Dick Campbell

March 22, 1930 - May 26, 2015

A.L. "Dick" Campbell, 85 of Madisonville, Texas, passed away on Tuesday, May 26, 2015 in Madisonville. Funeral services are scheduled for 11 a.m. on Friday, May 29th at The North Madison Church of Christ in Madisonville with Dr. Dale Underwood officiating. The visitation is scheduled for Thursday, May 28th from 5-8 p.m. at Day Funeral Home Chapel. Due to inclement weather, the burial will follow at a later date at the Madisonville City Cemetery.

Dick was born on March 22, 1930 in the Hollis Community near North Zulch, Texas to Thomas Mitchell and Faye (Rogers) Campbell. He was raised and educated in North Zulch, graduating from North Zulch High School and being later honored as one of the school's Distinguished Alumni. He served his country in The United States Army as a radio operator in the Korean War from February 1952 until February 1954. He was a lifetime member of the Masonic Lodge in North Zulch. Dick worked for many years as a pipeliner, traveling and working in almost every state in the U.S. He decided to leave that profession upon his marriage to Elayne Westmoreland in 1957 and began selling cars in Pasadena, Texas, but soon returned home to sell cars for Martin Standley here in Madisonville. Because of his success in the car business, he was able to purchase an interest in P.M. Standley Motor Co. and served as the dealership's president until 1982. Dick received numerous national awards from the Chrysler Corporation often beating out much larger dealers from metropolitan areas. In 1982, he decided to pursue his love of cattle ranching full time, typically preferring to do the work of clearing the land, raising hay and maintaining fences himself. He loved the time on his bulldozer, pushing trees and building ponds. He remained actively involved in the operation of the ranch until his death. Dick looked forward to long afternoons of dominos with his friends, playing every afternoon at his barn for the latter part of his life. He was very competitive; always looking for a challenge. He was known for having a great love of people, being trustworthy, kind and very generous to his family. He always prided himself on the trust others placed in him whether it involved buying a car or a bull or a parcel of land; his word was his bond.

Dick was preceded in death by his parents and his siblings, Maurine Wilhelm, Tommie

Faye Casey, Leon Campbell, and Jamie Campbell.

Dick is survived by his wife, Elayne (Westmoreland) Campbell; his son, Alan Campbell and his wife Becky; his daughter, Amy Campbell; his grandchildren, Elizabeth Ann Campbell, Katherine Elayne Campbell, Thomas "Tom" Scott Campbell, and Laney Ann Campbell; his brother, Jack Campbell; his sister-in-law, Ann Westmoreland; his nieces, Sondra Mobley and her husband, Sonny, Connie Vaught; his nephews, Mike Casey and his wife, Colleen and James Albert Adams, Jr. along with a host of friends.
