



## Billy George "Pete" Hunter

December 28, 1929 - September 23, 2020

Billy George "Pete" Hunter; 90 years, 8 months 25 days; of Madisonville, TX; passed away on Tuesday; September 22, 2020 in Madisonville, TX. Funeral services are scheduled for 10AM on Saturday; September 26, 2020 at The First United Methodist Church in Madisonville, TX with Rev. Jim Jackson officiating. The burial will follow at George Cemetery in Normangee, TX. The visitation is scheduled from 5-7PM on Friday; September 25, 2020 at Day Funeral Home Chapel in Madisonville, TX.

Pete was born on December 28, 1929 in "The George Community" to George and Ocie (Berry) Hunter. He graduated from Normangee High School in 1947 and served his county in The United States Army during the Korean War and was honorably discharged as a corporal.
