Sandra Lee (Green) Standley, 80, of Madisonville, TX; passed away on Sunday; November 27, 2016 at her home in Madisonville. A celebration of her life is scheduled for 2pm on Wednesday; November 30th at The First United Methodist Church in Madisonville with Rev. Patricia When-Glowski officiating. A private family burial is scheduled prior to the service on Wednesday at The Madisonville City Cemetery. Sandra was born on February 15, 1936 in Wharton, TX to Wynell and Al Taylor Green. She graduated from Sam Houston State University and was employed by the Pasadena Independent School District as a business accounting and typing teacher at Clear Lake High School from 1958-1959. In the early 1960's, she worked at the Madison County Auction Barn and served as President of Standley Feed & Seed from 1985-1990.

Sandra was a member of The First United Methodist Church where she served on numerous committees, most recently working with the after school tutoring program known as ASK. player and golfer where she made life-long friendships.
